Recommendation to the Bryan City Council to Pay Down Generation Debt

Mr. Steven Adams of Specialized Public Finance discussed an over-recovered balance in the BTU City System’s Power Cost Recovery Charge (PCRC) revenue. Use of these funds is restricted to BTU’s fuel, power supply, and generation activities. The Board unanimously approved a recommendation to the Bryan City Council to utilize these funds in an early pay down of debt related to BTU’s generation assets. If approved, prepaying this generation debt early will provide ratepayer savings of approximately \$1.54 million in avoided interest payments.

Contract Change Order with Southern Electric Corporation of Mississippi

The Board approved a change order to the original contract with Southern Electric Corporation of Mississippi, increasing the contract cap by \$162,462.21.

Change Order with Burns & McDonnell Engineering for the Tabor Substation Interconnection Project

The Board approved a change order to the contract with Burns & McDonnell Engineering for additional engineering services associated with alternate routing, design, and construction options for providing transmission-level service from the Tabor Substation area.

Consideration, Discussion, and Possible Action Regarding FY27 Non-Competitive Capital Improvement Projects and Operating & Maintenance Budgets

Ms. Alicia Kenney, interim CFO for the City of Bryan, presented an overview of the FY27 non-competitive CIP and O&M budgets. The Board unanimously approved Budget Resolution BTU-P-326 for final approval by the Bryan City Council.

Purchase of Six (6) Steel Poles for a Transmission Project

Mr. Randy Trimble, executive director of energy delivery, discussed the need to modify and build a transmission line out of BTU’s Tabor Substation, requiring six (6) steel poles. The Board approved a contract with Techline, Inc. for an amount not to exceed \$1,396,452 for the purchase of these poles.

Electricity Information Sharing and Analysis Center Letter of Recognition

Mr. Gary Miller, general manager, announced BTU received a letter of recognition from E-ISAC expressing appreciation for hosting the VISA workshop in April. Dee Montier-Burke, BTU’s regulatory compliance analyst, was explicitly thanked by E-ISAC for her work in making the workshop a significant success.

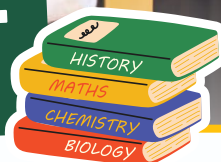

WAYS TO PAY YOUR BILL

We offer four convenient ways to pay your bill:



• Automatic Payments

- Authorize an automatic bank draft or credit/debit card payment on your bill's due date each month in your online account. This is the easiest way to pay and avoid penalties for late or non-payments!



• Pay by Phone

- To make a payment using BTU's Interactive Voice Response (IVR) system, call 979-821-5700 and follow the automated prompts. You'll need your account number (found on your monthly bill) handy to complete the transaction.



• Pay by Mail

- To pay by mail, detach the payment stub from your bill and send it along with a check or money order to:

- Be sure to include your account number on the check for prompt processing.
